

QUICK FACTS

The District manages the production of water from two sources: surface water from the Carmel River stored in San Clemente and Los Padres reservoirs; and groundwater pumped from municipal and private wells in Carmel Valley and the Seaside coastal area. The District also sells treated wastewater for use on golf courses and open space in Pebble Beach.

Legislated Functions:

1. Augment the water supply through integrated management of ground and surface water resources
2. Promote water conservation
3. Promote water reuse and reclamation of storm and wastewater
4. Foster the scenic values, environmental quality, native vegetation, fish and wildlife, and recreation on the Monterey Peninsula and in the Carmel River basin.
