Become a MWELO Certified Irrigation Auditor!

More certified auditors are needed! Since 2010, an irrigation audit has been required for landscape projects that are subject to the Model Water Efficient Landscape Ordinance (MWELO) or a local water efficient landscape ordinance. Consider adding this service to your business.

Who Conducts an Irrigation Audit?

An irrigation audit is performed by a certified irrigation auditor and cannot be the project designer or installer.

What is an Irrigation Audit?

An irrigation audit is an unbiased verification that installation was done according to the approved plans and MWELO requirements.

You will learn how to assess irrigation system performance, conduct field tests, and calculate accurate watering schedules based on plant water use, soils, and local weather data. This class provides foundational information for the certified landscape irrigation auditor exam.




Carmel River Steelhead Rescued Since 1989

Restoring the Carmel River Steelhead Population

Since 1989, the Monterey Peninsula Water Management District (MPWMD) has rescued almost 500,000 steelhead from drying portions of the Carmel River. The overall goal of the fish rescue and rearing program is to cultivate the growth of naturally-born juvenile steelhead and assist in the restoration, conservation, and maintenance of the population to return the steelhead to viable levels in the Carmel River.

Rescue and rearing greatly reduces the negative environmental impacts caused by diversion of surface and subsurface streamflow in the lower twenty-four miles of the Carmel River.


Rescued steelhead are either released into flowing upstream habitat or transported to MPWMD's Sleepy Hollow Steelhead Rearing Facility. When dry sections are replenished by the winter rains, the steelhead can be released into the river to continue their natural lifecycles. Learn more >

The Pure Water Monterey Expansion is expected to come online by the end of 2025. Funded and built by Monterey One Water, Monterey Peninsula Water Management District, and Marina Coast Water, it will expand the recycled water supply on the Peninsula to over 50% of existing customer demand and will provide for new housing and jobs.

Due to Cal Am's overdrafting of the Carmel River, the California State Water Board issued a Cease & Desist Order (CDO) in 2009 that continues to prevent water from being used for new projects. As of December 31, 2021, the new water supply from Pure Water Monterey ended Cal Am's overdrafting, but the State still has not lifted the CDO.

Water District preparations are currently underway to allocate the new water supply from the Expansion. Preparations include: 1) Allocating a portion of the water supply to local cities for new growth, 2) Anticipation of a decision from the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) that will update water supply and demand estimates and could help lift the CDO, and 3) Petitioning the State to lift the CDO and significantly expand housing and jobs.

Allocation of New Supply


The Expansion project is expected to bring an additional 2,250 acre-feet per year of new water supply to the Monterey Peninsula. The Water District is in the process of allocating a



MPWMD's new, easy-to-use hydrologic portal brings together data from gauges strategically located throughout the Carmel Watershed and beyond. Find answers to real-time and historical weather questions. Get useful data about rain, streamflow, reservoir levels, and more at our new website: MPWMD.nef — Answer questions like:

How much did it rain last night?
How much rain have we gotten so far this year?
Is the Lagoon going to breach?
Are you storing rainwater in the Seaside aquifer (ASR)?
How close is the Carmel River to flood stage?
Can you show me the Doppler radar for this storm?

Experts from MPWMD use the data to make decisions about water supply operations, steelhead rescues, and water rights. Cal Am uses it to monitor water pumping from the Carmel River and avoid overdratting the aquifer. Residents can use it to see whether there's enough water in the river for kayaking or fly fishing. It's there for all of us to use – a big orange tab on the middle-left of the MPWMD website home page that says fain & Streamflow Data (Glzmo).








We're injecting!



Pure Water Monterey Expansion on Track for 2025

In January, the final phase of the PWM Expansion project was initiated on former Ft. Ord property. When completed, two new wells will inject 2,250 acre-feet per year (730 million gallons) of new drinking water into the Seaside Groundwater Basin for Peninsula use. READ MORE >



Half a Billion Gallons of Rainwater Stored for Future

Last winter, MPWMD injected 495 Million Gallons from the Carmel River into the Seaside Groundwater Basin-the third best ASR injection season ever! That's enough water to serve 8,000 homes for a year. We now have 3,677 acrefeet stored in the ground for future use in a dry period.


